

These Comparison Overview Tables of State Consumer Privacy Laws (*Tables*) summarize key obligations in the enacted consumer privacy laws in California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Maryland, Montana, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, Oregon, Rhode Island, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, and Virginia (*State Consumer Privacy Laws*).

In these Tables, the following terms have the following meanings:

- personal data refers to personal data or personal information as defined in the State Consumer Privacy Laws; and
- process (and its variants) means any act performed on personal data.

Appendix 1 contains acronyms and abbreviations of commonly-referenced state and federal laws.

Appendix 2 contains common general exemptions and exclusions in the State Consumer Privacy Laws.
